PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The General English for Academic Purposes (GEAP) program is for students who wish to develop their language skills at one of the most prestigious language centres in Australia. To ensure students receive tuition that is tailored to their level of ability, they will sit a short placement test before their first class. Students can study the GEAP as a standalone program for personal or professional advancement or to gain credit towards a degree in their home University.

Objectives of this program include:

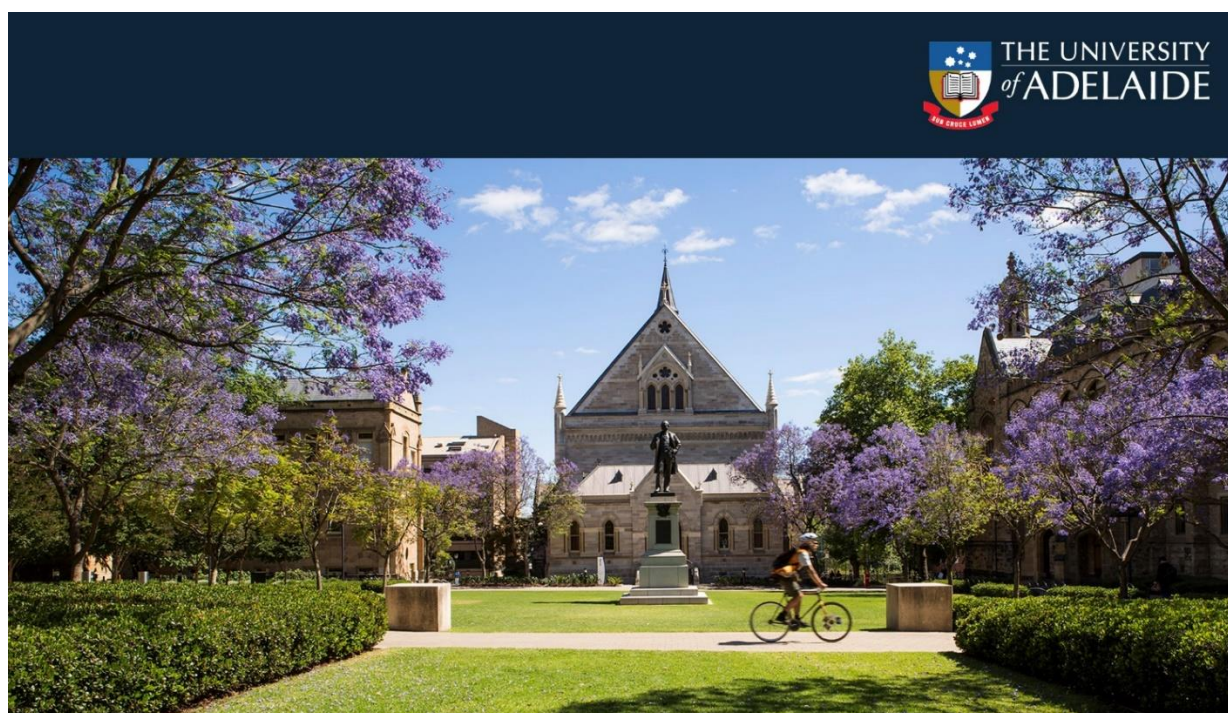
- Developed understanding of the structure and function of the English language

DELIVERY MODEL

This online program has been designed for groups who may not be able to physically come to Adelaide due to current travel restrictions. Participants have the opportunity to remain engaged with the world and gain experience in online delivery modes of learning.

Participants will use an online platform called Zoom, where they will participate in 'real-time', virtual classes, interacting and completing activities with other classmates, all the while guided by our expertly trained and qualified TESOL trainers.

Enrolled participants will also get access to university information technology and digital services. MyUni is the University of Adelaide's learning management system, on which participants will find course contents, communicate with teachers and peers, and receive grades and feedback.



ASSESSMENT AND CERTIFICATION

Participants will receive a program specific, A4 certificate and assessment grade report upon completion of their program.
